This term, your child will learn to: Say some counting words. Sing counting songs (e.g., 1,2,3,4,5 once I caught a fish) Place objects through different shaped holes. Attempt to fit shapes into spaces and play with puzzles. Use positional language e.g. Under, On top of. 	 This term, your child will learn to: Share things about themselves and their family e.g., photographs. Show interest and use toys with mechanisms e.g., buttons or flaps. Listen and show interest in stories about people, nature and our world. 	 Explore music through singing, listening, and playing with sound makers and instruments. Experiment with different tools and materials through sensory exploration. Create sound effects and movements e.g., animal sounds.
